JOB DESCRIPTION

JOB TITLE: MAINTENANCE CRAFT WORKER 2

DEPARTMENT: MAINTENANCE AND OPERATIONS

REPORTS TO: MAINTENANCE SUPERVISOR

DEFINITION

Under general supervision, performs skilled work in at least two trades (at least one from Painting, Glazing or Carpentry, or Welding and at least one from Plumbing or Electrical) and semiskilled work in several trades in the maintenance and repair of school buildings, facilities, grounds, and equipment; does related work as required.

EXAMPLES OF DUTIES

Positions in this classification are assigned specific tasks from at least two skilled trades (at least one from Painting, Glazing, Carpentry, or Welding and at least one from Plumbing or Electrical) plus a variety of maintenance tasks. Essential duties and responsibilities include the following:

Performs skilled and semi-skilled maintenance work in one or more of the building trades, such as:

- Repair, alteration, and installation involving electrical systems on a limited basis.
- Repair, alteration, and minor installation involving plumbing systems, including water lines, sewer lines, natural gas boilers, and related facilities and equipment.
- Repair, alteration, and minor installation involving heating and ventilating systems.
- Performs semiskilled carpentry maintenance work in the repair, alteration, and construction of buildings and related equipment.
- Installs window glass; builds forms and pours concrete of foundations; makes roof repairs; makes lock and doors closure repairs.
- Performs semiskilled maintenance work in the repair of asphalt, masonry, and plaster.
- Maintains and operates tools, equipment, and materials used in the above trades.
- Performs less skilled tasks independently and assists skilled workers,
- Performs semiskilled welding work
- Drive a light truck and operate other light motorized equipment.
- May serve as a lead man for other personnel assigned to assist in building maintenance and construction work.
- Other related tasks as assigned.

QUALIFICATIONS

To perform this job successfully, an individual must be able to perform the essential duties satisfactorily. The requirements listed below are representative of the knowledge, skill, and ability required. Reasonable accommodations may be made to enable individuals with disabilities to perform essential functions.

KNOWLEDGE OF:

- A minimum of four years paid experience in building maintenance and construction; in painting, glazing, or carpentry, plus two years experience in plumbing and/or electrical work.
- The equipment, tools, terms and methods used in building and equipment maintenance and in construction.

ABILITY TO:

- Perform heavy manual labor.
- Follow oral and written instructions.
- Establish and maintain effective working relationships with students, teachers, public and other District employees.

PHYSICAL DEMANDS

The physical demands described here are representative of those that must be met by an employee to successfully perform the essential functions of this job. Reasonable accommodations may be made to enable individuals with disabilities to perform the essential job functions.

- Person performing service in this position classification will exert 50 to 75 pounds of force frequently to lift, carry, push, pull, or otherwise move objects and occasionally will lift up to 90 pounds.
- This type of work may involve ascending and descending ladders, stairs, scaffolding, and ramps and will involve walking or standing for extended periods.
- Perceiving the nature of sound, near and far vision, depth perception, providing oral information.
- The manual dexterity to operate equipment and use hand tools, and handle the work with various materials and objects.

ENVIRONMENT

- Work environment – indoors and outdoors
- Temperature – normal climate, occasional adverse weather conditions
- Chemical exposure – occasional: fertilizer, herbicides, pesticides, gasoline, oil, solvents
- Noise/vibrations – frequent: mower, blower, generator jack hammer and chipper
- Fumes/gases/odors – occasional: gasoline, oil, solvents
- Dust – frequent: blower, sander and concrete
- Work surfaces – grass, asphalt, concrete and rough terrain

EXPERIENCE AND EDUCATION

Any combination equivalent to training and experience that could likely provide the required knowledge, skills and abilities would be qualifying. A typical way to obtain the knowledge, skills and abilities would be:

EXPERIENCE:

A minimum of four years paid experience in building maintenance and construction.

EDUCATION:

Equivalent to completion of high school.

LICENSE REQUIREMENT

Possession of a valid California Operators License.
